For example, the perpetrator wrote: "I, Jessica Clark have (instead of "has") come to an agreement (we don't say this in standard English – we say, "agree") with Kelvin Blas today (missing a comma) January 30th (should not have "th"), 2020 (missing a comma) to allow him (missing "to") leave the US Military Base (Camp Phoenix – this base was shuttered by Coalition Forces in 2015 -- <https://mod.gov.ge/en/news/read/3100/camp-phoenix-closing-down-in-afghanistan>)...

If you don't want to believe me or call me, that's fine, but you will need to contact your local police or FBI office if you have already sent your hard-earned money to West African organized crime syndicates. I am sorry that we could not convince you, but maybe someone else in the United States can. Please stop will all further email inquiries, as my staff and I will no longer respond.

This is scam. U.S. military do NOT transit Lome airport as the only direct flight to the United States is an Ethiopian Airlines flight that is not Fly America Act compliant. In addition, few U.S. service members are in fact posted to Africa, and the few that are, would be transiting Addis Ababa, Nairobi, Cairo, or Lagos to the United States – NOT Lome.

We have seen this scam countless (as in hundreds of) times. Please do not contact the individuals involved anymore. We cannot protect you from any financial loss. Only you can. If you have already sent money, then you need to immediately stop sending funds and contact your local police or your local FBI office to file a criminal complaint.

We would need to know more information than this, including the full name, date of birth or most recent passport number of the person. In addition, we would need to know your legal relationship to the individual before we could initiate a welfare and whereabouts service.

Please also know that Nigerian and Ghanaian organized crime often use the pretext of arrest at the Togo border or Lome airport to extort money from U.S. citizens, including those who have never been to Togo. If you have never met the individual in-person before, then you are a likely being targeted by sophisticated West African criminal syndicates who use a variety of social media to "phish" for our citizens who are willing to transfer money to bank accounts in West Africa before they realize the scam. Often, after realizing the scam after transferring funds to banks in West Africa, U.S. citizens are too embarrassed to report the crime to local or federal law enforcement, which is why this crime keeps happening.

If you believe you are being targeted, then you really ought to contact your local police department or local FBI office, as we cannot mitigate or insure against any financial loss to you – only you can by ensuring that you immediately cease contact with the individual purporting to be in distress. The Department of Justice just broke up a large Nigerian ring in Los Angeles this past summer -- <https://www.justice.gov/usao-cdca/pr/massive-international-fraud-and-money-laundering-conspiracy-detailed-federal-grand-jury>. West African wire fraud is a very serious problem in the United States. These are criminals who operate on both sides of the Atlantic and across multiple countries.

Just to follow up on this, I spoke with Mr. Burger Thursday afternoon. Sadly, our intuitions were correct, and Mr. Burger was the victim of a long con romance scam. He admitted that he'd been sending "Kelvin" \$250 USD a week for five years, along with other payments to help Kelvin with various alleged medical issues. All told I have a feeling he's lost more than \$100,000 USD. It was an emotionally devastating call for me, I can't begin to think how devastated Mr. Burger is.

I followed up by email with information and guidance on how to report the crime, as well as victim services information. I emphasized with him all the ways Embassy Lomé can assist a U.S. citizen, and provided the embassy's address and contact information for him to pass to "Kelvin."

As you have time, I recommend reopening the Kelvin Blas case in ACS+ as a w/w, entering a case note summarizing the situation, and attaching this email chain. "Kelvin" seems to use this identity with multiple victims, and may pop up in the future at another post or in Lomé after your tours of duty are complete. I think we can then consider this case closed.

The original message in this thread appears to have gone out to you all as well. Before I take any action helping to back up (b) (6) can you confirm whether or not you've already taken any action at post? I can see that Lomé consular employee (b) (6) ran a namecheck for this name approximately three years ago, but there are no other case notes associated with the case. That namecheck may line up with Mr. Burger trying to make a w/w inquiry when this "Kelvin" first told him about the problem. I'm picking up strong signs that Mr. Burger may be the victim of a scam. On the FTC's page about cyber scams, several people have reported being scammed by someone using the same name.

My name is **David Burger**, and I am contacting you for the second time regarding a serious matter involving my partner, **Sgt Kelvin Blas**, a **U.S. citizen and Army combat veteran** who is currently **stranded in Togo** under escalating legal and humanitarian distress.

We have already sent documentation to multiple offices. A formal dossier has been compiled and archived.

This email serves as **both a follow-up and a formal escalation.**

I respectfully request that this message not be discarded or delayed due to process routing. **This is a human being—an American veteran—left in danger.**

It's a waste of time contacting that embassy because as I stated in the report I filed.. the ambassador told Kelvin that "American's aren't black" and wouldn't help him at that time,

Then Kelvin went back to the embassy about a week later and they left him sitting there for 6 hours ignoring him again probably because he was black, then finally came to tell him that they were unaware that the person he needed to speak to was out on travel... Really? It takes 6 hours to search the embassy?

Because of their lack of help he has been in that country for over a year now, and has been sick at least 4 times with Malaria because he's been living on the streets.
